I urge you to take the time and have the conversations needed to make your plans, and to make those plans known to my office. Making these decisions prior to the time of death is a tremendous gift to your family.


A record of this form will be included in your clergy file at my office. Please call me if you wish to have a conversation about your plans. And, you have permission to adapt this form for use in your congregation.

## A Statement for the Guidance of my Church and Family upon my Death

The Minister of the Congregation is directed to instruct the people, from time to time, about the duty of Christian parents to make prudent provision for the well-being of their families, and of all persons to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses.

The Book of Common Prayer p. 445

The liturgy for the dead is an Easter liturgy. It finds all its meaning in the resurrection. Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we, too, shall be raised. The liturgy, therefore, is characterized by joy, in the certainty that "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." This joy, however, does not make human grief unchristian. The very love we have for each other in Christ brings deep sorrow when we are parted by death. Jesus himself wept at the grave of his friend. So, while we rejoice that one we love has entered into the nearer presence of our Lord, we sorrow in sympathy with those who mourn.

Baptized Christians are properly buried from the church. The service should be held at a time when the congregation has opportunity to be present. The coffin is to be closed before the service, and it remains closed thereafter. It is appropriate that it be covered with a pall or other suitable covering.

The Book of Common Prayer p. 490

It is customary for Clergy deaths, that the Bishop will coordinate the details of the service and all related arrangements.
