A chance meeting of Deacon Clelia Garrity and Victor, as he visited Ft. Walton Beach for only two days, has blossomed into an incredibly blessed partnership. In just a few short months a medical clinic and birthing program have been established deep within the African bush. Victor's leadership, imagination, hardwork, and deep faith in God has been, and continues to be, amazing. Five thousand bricks were built from mud and fired; an outdoor toilet, medical clinic, and birthing suite built; solar powered refrigeration installed; and a memorandum of understanding with the Zambian Ministry of Health developed. Incredibly, Rachael is now in her second year of nursing school. She will be the clinic manager upon graduation with a BSN and certification in midwifery. Monthly clinics provide medical care and much needed health care education.
